## What is Mission Support?

"Mission Support" is the portion of offerings that ELCA congregations share with synods and then synods share a percentage of this through the churchwide organization.

Why do we have Mission Support? Because the needs of people of our communities call us to work and give in love, for Jesus' sake. We are committed to God's life-giving work and believe we can do more together than we can do alone.

What does Mission Support do? It makes possible ministries close to home, across the ELCA, and around the world. It comes back to equip your congregation to share life in Jesus as it:

• Expands the capacity of congregational lay and rostered leaders. If you have attended a training for lay or rostered leaders, consulted with synod staff about a call process or conflict, participated in synod assembly or fall theological conference, or benefited from the work of Luther Seminary or The Continuous Growth Pathway.... your Mission Support makes these ministries possible.

Synod ministers and the bishop attend monthly rostered minister gatherings. One of our pastors wrote: "It's helpful to have information that you share, but even more, your presence is encouraging."

"The synod was very supportive throughout the call process. They provided clear guidelines as to how the call process works and what steps need to be followed in order to successfully call a Pastor. Most importantly, the synod was very helpful in supporting the call committee throughout the decision-making process.  Provides grants that truly make a difference for rostered ministers and congregations. Grants for rostered ministers are funded by the Gifts of Grace program and by synod endowments. Congregational Mission Grants are funded by synod endowments. All funds are administered and supported by the Gifts of Grace staff, Endowment Fund Committee, and synod staff.

- Communication and Administrative Support. This synod provides an abundance of learning and growth events to share with leaders, and these events require registrations and answers to questions. - **Grows the faith of youth.** We frequently hear congregation's concerns about supporting youth & families and the leaders who work with them.





If your congregation sends young people & adults to the Jr. & Sr. High Youth Gatherings, National Youth Gathering, or connects youth leaders through the Youth Ministry Network....These ministries in the synod and beyond happen because of your Mission Support.

• **Invests in evangelism and outreach.** ELCA grants support new mission congregations. Your synod convenes area partnership conversations as we see a greater number of transitions.

If you're curious about evangelism and what's new for the future, we have stories to tell! Reborn Lao Lutheran in St. Cloud regularly welcomes adults through baptism. House of Grace in Montrose provides a food ministry that truly makes a difference in the community and larger area. Many congregations are considering how to partner in a variety of ways with others in the area. All of this, thanks to your Mission Support.

• Connects us to ministry partners close to home and around the globe. Through our ELCA partners, we do together what we could not do as congregations alone.

Ever wonder how you can have relationships with Lutherans around the globe? Well, know that you do already! Visits by our friends from South Africa last fall and for Synod Assembly 2024 are rebuilding relationships with our global partners.
