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Anti-racism Training: Taking the Next Step

This day is not about:

Shame or blame.

You fixing your congregation or community or saving the world all by vourself.

Putting one more "should" on your plate.

This is a day about:

Providing a space to talk about real things that matter together.

Providing some context of how we got here, and what we can do to move forward

Reminding you who you are as a person.

A chance to think through and confront complex issues with others.

Taking one small step toward addressing racism in your own personal life and calling.

This workshop is intended as one opportunity to fulfill the SW MN Synod Council's resolution that "strongly recommends all rostered leaders, authorized ministers, and program staff (faith formation leaders, youth directors, etc.) to participate in annually offered workshops and trainings to develop greater appreciation for God's gifts of diversity in all people, deepen cultural competency, increase inclusion of our neighbors, practice equity, and better work toward for racial justice;" and that "Rostered Ministers report on the Rostered Ministers' annual report how this training involves at least 4 hours every two years." If you are unable to attend this particular training, note that we hope to offer other trainings in the future.
